President's Comments – Stipends for House/Senate Committee Chairs are up to \$25K.

Communication – Florida Sheriff Rick Wells (Sarasota) says, if you want to break into someone's home, you should expect to be shot." Wells is a Sheriff who openly celebrates homeowners defending themselves against criminals by exercising their 2nd Amendment rights.

NICS bias? Research indicates that an overwhelming majority of initial denials, approximately 99% are errors, affecting Hispanic and black males due to similarities in names.

EXPLORE Act sent to Biden's desk. Expanding Public Lands Outdoor Recreation Experiences Act would enhance the accessibility of federal lands to recreational shooters, hunters, and other outdoorsmen.

Numbers: In 2024 the number of Concealed carry permits increased for women 255% and 120% for men. 8.2% of American adults have permits. Indiana has 23.1% of the population, Alabama has 20.5% and Colorado has 17.7%. Florida revoked 2006 handgun permits but has 2.46 million permit holders.

ATF was using the NICS to monitor gun purchases. The ATF monitored people for their associations and the feeling that the "target

" might commit a crime in the future. The ATF tried to gag the FOIA request claiming that the documents were not in the public interest.

Legislation - Chapter 135 still has to be watched. The Council will support the bills filed by the MCA for the new session.

Hunter Ed / Fisheries & Wildlife – Basic Courses thru March 1st have been posted to the website. Five in-person, Four blended. A Class for Black Powder Instructors coming in April.

Ware River Watershed – Next meeting on January 30th in Rutland. DCR will speak about the Public Access Plan. Nothing exciting at the last meeting.

Quabbin Watershed Advisory – no information. Next meeting in tomorrow, January 6th at the visitor center. Deer Hunt numbers to be provided. Gate 8 updates are on the agenda.

Marine Fisheries – Changes for Striped Bass regulations are coming. Commercial size for Lobster changed by 1/16.
